Vision: From the Life of Hildegard of Bingen (2009)

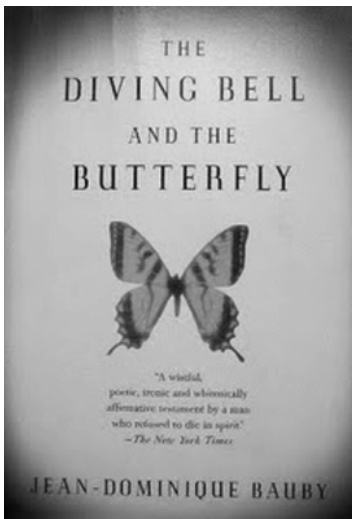

The Diving Bell and the Butterfly (2007)

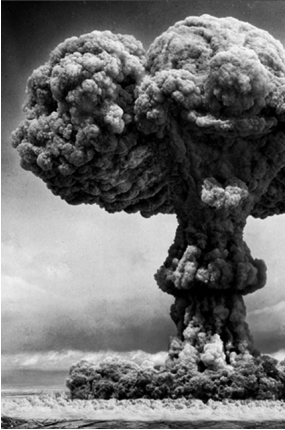

Veterans Against Nuclear War (2007)

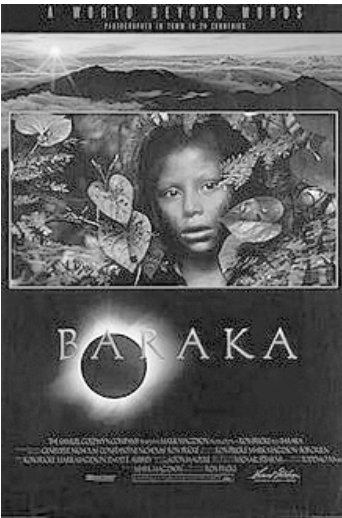

Baraka (1992)

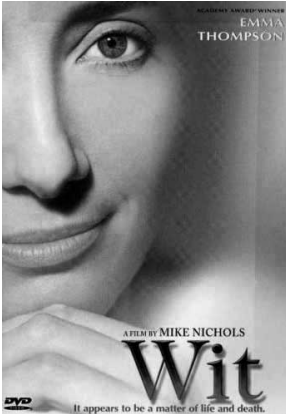
